Local Ballot Measures

- Prop A YES** More funding for transit, stronger limits on parking, more flexibility to Municipal Transportation Agency.
- Prop B YES** Appointees to City Commissions cannot serve more than 60 days beyond their designated terms.
- Prop C YES** Ballot measures must be introduced 45 days before election filing deadline to allow public discussion.
- Prop D NO** Raises funding to libraries without requiring library administrators to make any substantial improvements in hours of operation, services, or facilities. Allows administrators to cut library service hours after 2013.
- Prop E YES!** Mandates that the Mayor and Board of Supervisors meet together for a public discussion once per month.
- Prop F YES** Gives San Francisco police officers serving at airport equal retirement benefits to other City police officers.
- Prop G NO** Re-opens unneeded Golden Gate Park horse stables, with 3/4ths private funds, and a \$750,000 cost to City.
- Prop H NO!** Environmentally harmful, gridlock producing, massive increases in automobile parking in San Francisco.
- Prop I NO** Unnecessary, costly, small business center. Existing facilities and a simple web site would serve just as well.
- Prop J NO** Calls for San Francisco internet system to be built on slow, inferior, corporate influenced Wi-Fi technology.
- Prop K YES** Rejects increased advertising on City 'street furniture' such as park benches, bus shelters, City buildings.
